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13 ELEMENTS AND RELEVANT CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE OFFENSE:

14 IN COUNT ONE, THE DEFENDANT IS CHARGED WITH COMMITTING THE FELONY
15 CRIME OF ASSAULT BY MEANS LIKELY TO PRODUCE GREAT BODILY INJURY.

16 ON THE ABOVE DATE OFFICERS FROM THE LOS ANGELES POLICE DEPARTMENT
17 WERE DISPATCHED TO 333 NORTH JUNE STREET IN REGARDS TO A "SCREAMING WOMAN." THEY ARRIVED AT
18 THE SCENE AND CONTACTED THE VICTIM, WHO WAS SEATED IN THE DRIVER'S SEAT OF A VEHICLE PARKED
19 IN FRONT OF THE LOCATION.

20 OFFICERS NOTICED THE VICTIM WAS VERY UPSET AND CRYING. SHE STATED TO
21 THE OFFICERS, "HE BEAT ME UP." THEY ASKED THE VICTIM WHO HAD BEAT HER UP AND SHE SAID, "MY
22 BOYFRIEND, CHRIS BROWN."

23 THE VICTIM WENT ON TO SAY SHE AND THE DEFENDANT WERE ATTENDING A
24 FUNCTION AT THE BEVERLY HILTON HOTEL. THEY LEFT THE EVENT TOGETHER SHORTLY AFTER MIDNIGHT.
25 WHILE THEY WERE DRIVING TO THE VICTIM'S RESIDENCE THEY BECAME INVOLVED IN AN ARGUMENT
26 ABOUT SOMETHING THAT HAD OCCURRED AT THE EVENT. THE VICTIM SAID SHE BECAME "ENRAGED" AND
27 SLAMMED BOTH OF HER FISTS AGAINST THE DASHBOARD ON THE PASSENGER SIDE OF THE CAR THEY WERE
28 IN. SHE REPORTED THAT THE DEFENDANT THEN PULLED THE VEHICLE OVER AND REACHED OVER HER WITH

1 HIS RIGHT HAND. HE OPENED THE CAR DOOR AND TRIED TO FORCE THE VICTIM OUT. HE WAS UNABLE TO
2 DO SO BECAUSE THE VICTIM WAS WEARING A SEATBELT. WHEN HE COULD NOT FORCE HER TO EXIT, HE
3 TOOK HIS RIGHT HAND AND SHOVED HER HEAD AGAINST THE PASSENGER WINDOW OF THE CAR. THE
4 VICTIM THEN FACED THE DEFENDANT AND HE PUNCHED HER IN THE LEFT EYE WITH HIS RIGHT HAND. HE
5 THEN CONTINUED DRIVING.

6 AS HE DROVE, HE CONTINUED TO PUNCH THE VICTIM IN THE FACE WITH HIS
7 RIGHT HAND WHILE STEERING THE VEHICLE WITH HIS LEFT HAND. THE VICTIM SAID THE ASSAULT CAUSED
8 HER MOUTH TO FILL WITH BLOOD AND BLOOD TO SPLATTER OVER HER CLOTHING AND THE INSIDE OF THE
9 CAR.

10 WHEN THE DEFENDANT STOPPED HIS FIRST ASSAULT AGAINST THE VICTIM SHE
11 LOOKED IN THE MIRROR AND SAW HER EYE BEGINNING TO SWELL. THE DEFENDANT LOOKED AT THE
12 VICTIM AND SAID, "I'M GOING TO BEAT THE SHIT OUT OF YOU WHEN WE GET HOME! YOU WAIT AND SEE!"
13 THE VICTIM PICKED UP HER CELL PHONE AND TRIED TO CALL HER PERSONAL ASSISTANT. HOWEVER HER
14 ASSISTANT DID NOT ANSWER. WHILE THE VOICE MAIL GREETING WAS PLAYING THE VICTIM PRETENDED TO
15 TALK, SAYING, "I'M ON MY WAY HOME. MAKE SURE THE COPS ARE THERE WHEN I GET THERE." THE VICTIM
16 TOLD POLICE SHE DID THIS BECAUSE SHE DID NOT WANT TO GET BEAT ANY MORE. AT THAT TIME THE
17 DEFENDANT LOOKED AT THE VICTIM AND SAID, "YOU JUST DID THE STUPIDEST THING EVER! NOW I'M
18 REALLY GOING TO KILL YOU!"

19 THE DEFENDANT BEGAN A SECOND WAVE OF PUNCHES DURING WHICH TIME
20 THE VICTIM INTERLOCKED HER FINGERS BEHIND HER HEAD AND BROUGHT HER ELBOWS FORWARD TO
21 PROTECT HER FACE. SHE BENT AT THE WAIST PLACING HER ELBOWS AND FACE NEAR HER LAP IN ORDER TO
22 PROTECT HERSELF FROM THE BARRAGE OF PUNCHES. THE DEFENDANT CONTINUED TO PUNCH THE VICTIM
23 ON HER LEFT ARM, WHICH CAUSED HER TO SUFFER A CONTUSION ON HER LEFT TRICEP. WHEN THE
24 DEFENDANT STOPPED HITTING HER THE VICTIM AGAIN PICKED UP HER CELL PHONE AND TRIED TO SEND A
25 TEXT MESSAGE TO ANOTHER ASSISTANT. THE DEFENDANT SNATCHED THE CELL PHONE OUT OF HER HAND
26 AND THREW IT OUT THE WINDOW OF THE CAR ONTO THE STREET. HE THEN STOPPED THE VEHICLE. THE
27 VICTIM OPENED THE PASSENGER DOOR AND TRIED TO EXIT IN ORDER TO GET HER CELL PHONE BACK.
28 BEFORE SHE COULD GET OUT THE DEFENDANT SPED OFF, CAUSING THE DOOR TO CLOSE.

1 AS THE DEFENDANT WAS DRIVING THE VICTIM SAW HIS CELL PHONE SITTING IN
 2 HIS LAP. SHE TOOK THE CELL PHONE WITH HER LEFT HAND AND TRIED TO MAKE A CALL. BEFORE SHE
 3 COULD, THE DEFENDANT PLACED THE VICTIM'S HEAD IN A HEADLOCK WHILE HE CONTINUED TO DRIVE. HE
 4 PULLED THE VICTIM CLOSE AND BIT HER ON HER LEFT EAR. THE VICTIM TOLD POLICE SHE COULD FEEL THE
 5 VICTIM SWERVING FROM LEFT TO RIGHT AS THE DEFENDANT WAS SPEEDING AWAY. THE DEFENDANT
 6 STOPPED THE VEHICLE IN FRONT OF 333 NORTH JUNE STREET AND THE VICTIM WAS ABLE TO TURN OFF THE
 7 IGNITION AND REMOVE THE KEYS. SHE SAT ON THE KEYS. THE DEFENDANT DID NOT KNOW WHAT THE
 8 VICTIM DID WITH THE KEYS AND STARTED PUNCHING HER AGAIN IN THE FACE AND ARMS. HE PLACED HER
 9 IN A HEADLOCK, POSITIONING THE FRONT OF HER THROAT BETWEEN HIS BICEP AND FOREARM. HE THEN
 10 STARTED APPLYING PRESSURE TO HER CAROTID ARTERY, WHICH MADE HER UNABLE TO BREATHE. SHE
 11 TOLD POLICE SHE STARTED TO LOSE CONSCIOUSNESS. SHE REACHED UP WITH HER LEFT HAND AND
 12 STARTED GOUGING AT THE DEFENDANT'S FACE AND EYES IN ORDER TO FREE HERSELF. THE DEFENDANT BIT
 13 THE VICTIM'S LEFT RING AND MIDDLE FINGERS AND THEN RELEASED HER.

14 THE VICTIM TOLD POLICE SHE THEN TOOK OFF HER SHOE AND TRIED TO BREAK
 15 THE PASSENGER WINDOW. THE DEFENDANT CONTINUED TO PUNCH HER AND SHE TURNED AROUND AND
 16 PLACED HER BACK AGAINST THE PASSENGER DOOR. SHE BROUGHT HER KNEES TO HER CHEST AND PLACED
 17 HER FEET AGAINST THE DEFENDANT'S BODY TO PUSH AWAY FROM HIM. THE DEFENDANT PUNCHED THE
 18 VICTIM ON HER LEGS AND FEET CAUSING SEVERAL CONTUSIONS. THE DEFENDANT CEASED HIS ASSAULT
 19 AND THE VICTIM OPENED THE PASSENGER DOOR AND STARTED SCREAMING FOR HELP.

20 THE DEFENDANT EXITED FROM HIS SIDE OF THE CAR AND WALKED AROUND TO
 21 THE PASSENGER SIDE AND FORCED THE DOOR SHUT. THE VICTIM AGAIN OPENED THE DOOR AND
 22 CONTINUED SCREAMING. THE DEFENDANT STARTED PUNCHING THE VICTIM IN THE RIGHT ARM AND AGAIN
 23 CLOSED THE DOOR. THE VICTIM FORCED THE DOOR OPEN AND CONTINUED HER SCREAMING. THE
 24 DEFENDANT RETURNED TO THE DRIVER'S SIDE OF THE CAR AND SCREAMED, "WHERE ARE MY FUCKING
 25 KEYS?" THE VICTIM CONTINUED SCREAMING. THE DEFENDANT LOOKED FOR THE KEYS OUTSIDE THE
 26 VEHICLE. WHEN HE COULD NOT FIND THEM HE REMOVED SEVERAL COMPACT DISCS THAT WERE INSIDE THE
 27 CAR AND WALKED AWAY.

28

1 OFFICERS ARRIVED JUST AS THE DEFENDANT HAD WALKED AWAY. THEY
2 SEARCHED THE AREA FOR HIM BUT COULD NOT FIND HIM.

3 MULTIPLE PHOTOGRAPHS WERE TAKEN OF THE VICTIM, AS WELL AS THE INSIDE
4 OF THE VEHICLE. OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THE CRIME SCENE OBSERVED BLOOD INSIDE THE VEHICLE.

5 OFFICERS AT THE SCENE OBSERVED NUMEROUS CONTUSIONS AND ABRASIONS
6 TO THE VICTIM'S FACE AND FOREHEAD, AS WELL AS BRUISING ON HER LEFT ARM NEAR THE BICEP. THEY
7 ALSO SAW ABRASIONS TO HER ARMS NEAR BOTH WRISTS AND ON HER UPPER CHEST NEAR HER
8 COLLARBONE AND AROUND HER NECK. THERE WERE ABRASIONS ON HER LEFT LEG AND ON THE INSIDE OF
9 HER UPPER LIPS. AT THE TIME THE VICTIM COMPLAINED OF PAIN. SHE LATER SOUGHT MEDICAL
10 TREATMENT ON HER OWN AT CEDAR SINAI HOSPITAL.

11 INVESTIGATORS LATER DETERMINED THAT THE DEFENDANT WAS WEARING A
12 LARGE RING ON HIS RIGHT HAND AND THAT HIS ITEM CAUSED SEVERAL OF THE VICTIM'S INJURIES.

13 DURING THE COURSE OF THE INVESTIGATION DETECTIVES LEARNED OF TWO
14 EARLIER INCIDENTS RELATED TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE THAT WENT UNREPORTED. THE FIRST INCIDENT
15 OCCURRED IN EUROPE ABOUT THREE MONTHS BEFORE THE PRESENT OFFENSE. THE VICTIM AND
16 DEFENDANT WERE INVOLVED IN A VERBAL DISPUTE AND THE VICTIM SLAPPED THE DEFENDANT. HE
17 RESPONDED BY SHOVING HER INTO A WALL. THE SECOND INCIDENT OCCURRED ABOUT THREE WEEKS PRIOR
18 TO THE INSTANT OFFENSE IN BARBADOS. THE DEFENDANT AND VICTIM WERE VISITING BARBADOS AND
19 WERE DRIVING A RANGE ROVER LOANED TO THEM BY A LOCAL DEALERSHIP. THEY HAD AN ARGUMENT
20 INSIDE THE CAR. THE DEFENDANT EXITED AND BROKE THE FRONT DRIVER AND PASSENGER SIDE WINDOWS
21 OF THE CAR. NO ONE WAS INJURED DURING THE INCIDENT. THE VEHICLE WAS REPAIRED AND THE INCIDENT
22 WAS NOT REPORTED.

I am writing this letter in support of Chris Brown. My name is Barry Weiss, and I'm the Chairman and CEO of the RCA/JIVE Label Group. I have known Chris since he was signed to the label when he was just 15-years old. Over the years I've come to regard him as a surrogate son. My wife and I have two sons close to Chris' age whom have hung out with Chris growing up and we have spent time together in his home and elsewhere.

Having worked with several high-profile teen artists and bands over the course of my twenty-five year career, I cannot express or emphasize enough how shocked I was to learn about the incident that occurred with Chris.

In the course of business, I've worked closely with several artists through their misjudgments and errors, but this has been the one that has taken me completely by surprise because it was totally outside of Chris' character. I've seen him mature from an unusually focused, bright, talented, essentially "country" kid from Tappahannock, Virginia, into a global teen super-star; this is never an easy transition. However, this stands out to me because in spite of his youth, fame and success, Chris remains to this day one of the most grounded, well-mannered, hard-working young men I've ever known. Those of us who know him well at the label often refer to him as a "good kid" because although he is a young man, he really does possess the exuberance, humor, optimism and innocence of a good kid. Much of the credit for this goes to his mother, Joyce who has done a tremendous job single-handedly providing Chris with a sense of normalcy and balance.

I understand the seriousness of his actions, but most importantly, he does. He is 100% committed to taking responsibility and in using his celebrity to increase awareness about all of the issues the incident has raised. I know this experience has fundamentally changed him and that he is dedicated to doing everything he needs to insure that something like this never happens again.

I've remained close to him since the incident in February and I can say that he's genuinely remorseful, and he's made it clear to me that he wants to do everything he can to use this unfortunate situation to enlighten and educate young people worldwide about issues of anger management and self restraint.

Dear Judge Schnegg,

I am writing this letter in support of Chris Brown. As a Partner at the Law Firm of Grubman, Indursky and Shire PC, I represent many of the world's most famous entertainers. In this capacity, I have had the privilege to represent Chris and to get to know both Chris and his family; especially his mother Joyce who also serves as his Co-Manager. I use the word "privilege" intentionally, because in getting to know Chris, I have found him to be not only a great entertainer, but a truly good person. Whereas many other superstars can be selfish, self-absorbed and uncaring, Chris is actually the opposite. He is a great kid, who although just having turned 20 years of age, has already used his fame and celebrity status to help those who are less fortunate. By way of example, Chris has served as a spokesperson for St Jude's Children Hospital. In addition to serving as their spokesperson, Chris has donated money from his concert tours to the hospital. Moreover, Chris traveled to Africa with Oprah Winfrey to help the underprivileged children who were attending Oprah's school. While in Africa, Chris taught dance classes and performed for the students at Oprah's school. In addition to his participation at Oprah's school, Chris also separately visited an orphanage while he was in Africa to help brighten up the day for children who were suffering without parents or a home of their own. Chris also has participated in a dental hygiene program sponsored by Crest and spoke to children about the need and importance of good dental hygiene. Moreover, at the time of the incident, Chris was forming his own Charitable Foundation and was also working with the local school district where he grew up in Virginia to donate instruments and participate in a music program at the schools. Although, these programs had to be put on hold when Chris was dealing with this case, he fully intends to follow up with these programs in the immediate future.


In addition, Chris is always surrounded and guided by his mother. Joyce is a great and caring person and serves as a daily positive influence in Chris' life. From the outset of Chris' career she has kept a watchful eye over him both as a mother and as a Co-Manager. She lives on the same block as Chris in Virginia; only a couple of houses away. Joyce virtually always travels with him when he tours or makes promotional appearances; including trips to Europe, Japan, Australia and New Zealand. Indeed, Joyce is nearly always by Chris' side and has been with him at every court appearance in this case. She has taught Chris important family values and the difference between right and wrong. For 19 years, Chris had lived an exemplary life. Although, he was not wealthy and lived in a home where he witnessed domestic violence against his mother, Chris never had any problems with the law or in the community. To the contrary, he was an incredible role model—the kid who made good and gave back to his community.

I am not asking this Court to excuse Chris' behavior in connection with this incident. In fact, Chris himself, to his credit has accepted full responsibility for his actions and apologized both publically and privately. However, I do feel it is important for Your Honor to know the other side of Chris Brown—the person who without any fanfare or publicity has helped the underprivileged children and the sick children confined to hospitals and orphanages. The person who has donated both his time and his money to help children and the young man who had never previously been in trouble with the law.

Based upon the foregoing, I respectfully request that the Court consider how Chris Brown can help the community when imposing the parameters of his sentence; especially as it relates to Community Service. Clearly, there are so many positive ways that Chris can be utilized to help children, teenagers and others. I urge the Court to authorize these activities to be approved for purposes of his Community Service. It would be so much better for everyone, if Chris Brown's celebrity could be used positively to help other people.
