**Re: Lindsay Lohan, Case no. BH07BV01538-01**

Dear Judge Revel:

I represent Michael Lohan, the father of Lindsay Lohan, defendant in the above referenced action.

Mr. Lohan is gravely concerned about his daughter's prescription drug use, which continues to the present notwithstanding her current regime of random drug testing and alcohol monitoring via the SCRAM bracelet.

As her recent probation report, dated June 30, 2010, states:

The Court should note that the defendant takes the following prescription drugs: Nexium, Zoloft, Trazadone, Adderall, and sometimes Diladid for dental pain.

The defendant was tested for drugs and alcohol on May 27, 2010 and the test was positive for amphetamines. This is not a violation of probation as the test result is positive because of the drug Adderrall. The next two tests on June 2, 2010 and June 7, 2010 were positive for amphetamines and opiates. This is not a violation of probation, as these tests were positive for Adderall and the pain medication Diladid. The test results from June 16, 2010 and June 24, 2010 were positive for amphetamines. Once again there is no probation violation as the positive result is a result of the drug Adderall.

Prescription drug abuse is at epidemic levels in the United States today. According to the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy, prescription drug abuse ranks second after marijuana as the nation's most prevalent drug problem.

Prescription drug abuse has killed Hollywood stars like Michael Jackson, Heath Ledger, Anna Nicole Smith, and Marilyn Monroe. Prescription drug abuse is more prevalent than abuse of cocaine, heroin, or crystal meth.

Mr. Lohan does not believe his daughter has any medical reason to take any prescription drugs at all, much less regular use of amphetamines and opiates. She is in good health. To his knowledge, she has no medical condition that would warrant the use of these drugs. She has never needed prescription medications before.

The giant legal loophole allowing Ms. Lohan to continue to ingest amphetamines and opiates must be closed. We can no longer close our eyes to the reality that Hollywood celebrities like Mr. Lohan's daughter can easily get any prescription medications they desire from doctors, with little or no oversight. In other cases, such as the Anna Nicole Smith case, after her death, her doctors are now being investigated on charges of overprescribing unnecessary medications.

Mr. Lohan refuses to wait until a catastrophe befalls his daughter from prescription drug use. He loves her. He wants her to live. Mr. Lohan therefore asks the court to disallow these prescription medications immediately, and to disallow them for the remainder of the term of her probation, including during any period of incarceration. Mr. Lohan also believes strongly that the doctors who are prescribing them should be investigated for unlawful overprescribing of medication.
